• Principal's Monthly Family Forums:

Blue Ribbon Schools of Excellence

- Initial assessment conducted in September. Thanks to all that participated in parent focus groups, feedback, etc.
- Feedback received in 9 categories; must reach 80% proficiency in each to earn Lighthouse Blue Ribbon School designation, targeted for next school year.
- Parent and community involvement indicators received overwhelmingly positive feedback; no improvement needed.

- Current enrollment is 552, a 50-student increase from last year; minimal student loss over summer.
 Kindergarten enrollment is open for the year.
- Our school is fully staffed with the exception of a Special Education Assistant position.

School Selection


- The school selection process closes October 23.
- Out-of-catchment families must apply to be considered; no exceptions if not in the applicant pool.
 Sibling preference applies in the lottery for all grades, but out-of-catchment siblings must still apply.
 Initial enrollment prioritizes sibling families; additional spaces may open in summer if available.

Review of PTA 2025-26 Budget



- The budget has increased due to excellent fundraising; More support has been allocated to funding teacher initiatives, classroom support, field trips, garden, arts, athletics, and beautification.
- Teacher reimbursement increased from \$100 to \$250 for grade level teachers; from \$200 to \$350 for specialist teachers; expanded eligibility to nurse, counselors, aides.

\$51,690 Total Expenses

- Membership Votes: 3 motions presented
 - 2024-2025 Audit Report Approval An audit was performed by a CPA this year. 34 votes in favor.
 None opposed. Motion APPROVED.
 - Request to increase mini-grant budget this year from \$3,000 to \$5,000 due to high demand. 34 votes in favor. None opposed. Motion APPROVED.
 - Request to roll last year's \$20,000 certificate of deposit (CD) at ~4% interest into a new
 7-month CD upon maturity (October 20) which could help with inflative cost. 34 votes in favor.
 None opposed. Motion APPROVED.
